

Soft Skill Session for Grade V and VI


“Soft skills are the key to success in every sphere of life.”

“Protect the Earth, it’s our home.”



Numbers are essential in our everyday life. The number system helps us represent quantities, define values, and perform calculations, making it an important tool for learning, understanding, and managing daily activities.




Class Activities - Grade V

“Freedom is not given, it is earned with courage and sacrifice.”



“Reading is to the mind what exercise is to the body.”


